On the last night of his life, as evening fell, Jesús sat down to dinner with his friends. He took the bread, gave thanks, broke it, and passed it around the table for everyone to eat, saying,

All people: This is my body, given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me.

Pastor: When the meal had ended, the shadows closing in, Jesus took the cup, blessed

it, and invited everyone to drink, saying:

All people: This cup is the new covenant in my blood, shed for you and for all people for

the forgiveness of sin. Do this for the remembrance of me.

Pastor: In the heart of fear and pain, God plants the seed of our joy:

All people: Christ has died. Christ is risen.

Christ will come again.

Pastor: Send your Spirit upon this bread and cup, Christ's body and blood, the food that

gives us the strength to persist until joy appears. Send your Spirit upon us and fortify us to be your body, too, a wellspring of hope for a world in need. All glory, power, and honor are yours, God of brilliant resurrection and quiet joy, today and

every day.

All people: Amen.
